West Oso ISD began its celebration of Black History Month on Monday, February 3, 2025 and will continue to celebrate and educate throughout the month of February. Activities will include campus luncheons, reading and studying about famous African-Americans, library book displays, and daily announcements that spotlight African-Americans throughout history. Black History Month, founded in 1915 by Carter G. Woodson, the son of former slaves, and the “Father of Black History,” celebrates the achievements of Black Americans and recognizes the central role they had in shaping U.S. history. The 2025 Black History Month theme, African Americans and Labor, focuses on the various and profound ways that work and working of all kinds – free and unfree, skilled, and unskilled, vocational and voluntary – intersect with the collective experiences of Black people.

The celebration of Black History will culminate with the district-wide Black History Multicultural Celebration scheduled for Friday, February 21, 2025, at the West Oso Junior High School Auditorium, 5202 Bear Lane, Corpus Christi, TX 78405 from 9:30 am to 11:30 am. The event will include dance, musical, and poetry readings by students in grades PK-12. As the West Oso ISD community comes together to celebrate Black History Month, it is a time to reflect on the past, appreciate the present, and look forward to the future. “We want our students to be proud of their heritage,” said Kimberly Moore, West Oso ISD Superintendent. “It is through awareness, celebration, and inclusivity that we can help to enrich the educational experience for all our students.
