B. Successes

The district is successful in its outreach to involve the community in building relationships within the family unit as well as with surrounding businesses among all campuses. This year was also the Second Annual Business Partnership Breakfast which was also in conjunction with Career Day at the high school. New educational partnerships were formed with Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, Lyondell Bassell, Hammonds Educational Leadership Program (HELP) and Fish for Life. Students from JFK and WOE participated in the district Science Fair at TAMU-CC.

This year, JFK and WOE shared a music teacher, which was very beneficial to the students' knowledge and appreciation of music.

C. Needs

West Oso ISD should provide more academic activities for students to demonstrate their abilities. A community partnership with PTA/PTO mentorship would benefit students at the secondary level. In addition, ESL and GED classes need to be provided to parents and the community. The two elementary campuses would benefit from a Fine Arts Program with a Certified Art Teacher. The district also needs affordable internet access for students and their families. The City of Corpus Christi provides free Wi-Fi, but parts of our community are excluded from the service which hinders some students from completing homework and/or projects.

D. Priorities

It would be beneficial for all campuses to establish an active PTA/PTO to encourage additional academic activities for community, parents, and students to participate in. The elementary campuses need to implement a Fine Arts Program in art to increase student knowledge of art and encourage parental involvement opportunities. Community and business partners as mentors for at-risk students would be beneficial to increasing academic success.

West Oso High School and West Oso ISD continue to embrace their mission and vision of preparing students for success in their 21st century endeavors. The mission and vision are embodied in the daily course offerings in the district. Lesson plans reflect relevant and collaborative subject matter, and these lessons are often augmented with use of technology; as the district added computers/smart-boards and chrome books. The CATE program continues to groom pupils for post-secondary opportunities via its challenging and relevant curriculum coupled with its enriching extra-curricular activities. The West Oso ISD AVID program continues to grow; as it featured the addition of additional teacher positions and enrollment of students. Career days were held at all four campuses this year. The ROTC program continues to thrive as cadets earned local, statewide and national recognition. Del Mar College is as a partner in the education of students who attend West Oso ISD. The formal partnership afforded students a wider range of Dual Credit and Advanced Placement course offerings, while creating an avenue for the possibility of housing post-secondary educational courses taught by university instructors on West Oso High School's campus.

The Early College High School is currently in its fourth year of existence. In the program students may receive 60 college hours towards an associate degree. Each year 50 incoming freshmen students are selected to make up a cohort.

A huge point of pride for West Oso ISD is the relationships that we have built with our business and community partners. The 3nd annual business breakfast was held on November 1st, 2018. One hundred and fifty representatives from government, corporations, higher education, and civic leadership attended this event. Following this event, many of the attendees have continued to support our schools in various ways. The Hammons Educational Leadership Program (HELP) along with financial support from business partners established a Career Exploration program in the junior high and high school. Guest speakers from the engineering and medical field spoke to AVID classes. Students were then able to go on field trips to visit a hospital and engineering firm. There are business partners on our ECHS Advisory board as well as our newly formed STEM Advisory council. A group of teachers spent their professional development day touring Lyondell Bassell, a refining company that is one of our new partners. This company donated all the supplies that the process technology students would need to begin their program of study.

With the addition of an experienced and passionate business teacher, the UIL accounting team was formed. Students on this team won numerous awards at these competitions, including 1st place in district. The High School added the Finance Pathway through the Business and Industry Endorsement. Students will have the opportunity to take accounting I and II.

C. Needs

West Oso ISD seeks to further explore the breadth and depth of scholarly opportunities available through its partnerships and actively seek additional partnerships. It is the intention of the district to raise the number of college credits earned by students in high school, while aspiring to ensure students have the opportunity to graduate with professional licenses and certifications. In committing to its mission and vision, West Oso ISD looks to increase the number of trips to colleges, universities, and industries, while also increasing the number of colleges, universities, and industries to visit the district's campuses.

D. Priorities

Enriching the educational opportunities of the district's diverse student body remains the greatest priority of West Oso ISD. With a multitude of studies reflecting the magnitude of college/university training in determining post-secondary school quality of life; continuing to explore opportunities for students to receive relevant educational opportunities will remain of paramount importance to the district. Next year, there will be a focused effort on providing internship experiences for students. There will also be more attention on preparing students for SAT/ACT exams, and supporting students in their college application process

Written policies for identification and assessment, and procedures implemented for transfers, furloughs, re-assessment and exiting procedures are updated and provided. Teachers remain in classroom rather than missing day(s) for G/T training. 6-hour update offered at the beginning of the academic year (August) and online, 30-hour training offered online. Teachers who provide GT services have a minimum of 30 hours training including nature and needs, identification and assessment and C & I prior to assignment or within one semester of assignment. Multiple criteria are used for identification at Kindergarten level, and all students are automatically considered for GT or other advanced services. Appropriately trained selection committee makes final determinations for placement. Products and achievements of gifted/talented students are aligned to the rigorous GT standards and are shared with the community at the district wide Celebration of Education Showcase.

C. Needs

GT policies and procedures need to be Board approved every 3 years. Additional funding from business partnerships, scholarships, group fundraisers, etc., is needed to supplement state and local funding for programming especially if GT funding is cut through the state revenues. GT staff should be involved in planning and conducting GT staff development.

D. Priorities

In order to meet the needs of our GT population, and the TEA State Plan for The Education of Gifted and Talented Student's, planning for the 2019-2020 school year will take place during the summer of 2019. The STEM Education

Program will work to increase rigor in the curriculum for the GT population. Continued transparency with parents and community stakeholders will provide value and credibility to the WOISD Gifted and Talented Program.

In addition, we have partnerships with the Juvenile Justice Board, State Assessment Training, and teacher appraisal training for all necessary staff, Emergency Operations Plan training for all staff and hazardous chemical materials, disability training, Suicide Prevention training, Teen Dating Violence Training, and pest management for required employees. Further trainings include: Dyslexia, Discipline, Blood Borne Pathogens, Title I, HIPPA, FERPA, and training on Public Funds.
